Board Minutes

II-March-2018

G.B. Washburn called the meeting to order. Bud Hippisley had our opening prayer. Minutes were reviewed. Gusta made a motion to approve and Ruth seconded the motion, motion carried.

Treasurer's Report- There was no treasurer's report. G.B. did state that the church had been actively looking for another bank for some time. After much discussion and careful consideration Snow Creek Christian Church has decided to move accounts to Union Bank. A motion was made by George Martin and seconded by Janet Perdue and unanimously approved by the Church Board to do the following:

Open two checking accounts and obtain one debit card for each account.

Troy Washburn, Delmas Smith, and Gordon B. Washburn, Jr. will have full access to all accounts which includes writing checks, making debit purchases, and completing online and in person transactions.

Debra W. Haynes will be able to use a Debit Card and write Checks on Account Number two.

Pastor's Report- Bill reported that he has been very pleased with the way things are going at the church especially with the youth and their excitement to collect money for the Week of Compassion offering.

Bill made 17 home, hospital or rehab facility visits since our last meeting. He still wants to work on doing more home visits. He attended one Senior's meeting, one VBS planning meeting and one Easter community service planning meeting. He participated in the World Day of Prayer and completed the course he was taking on the book Revelation.

Bill stated the coming month will be a very busy month with all of the various Easter events coming up. Bill will lead the Easter Sunrise Service at Boones Chapel Church of Brethren at 7:00 a.m.

Committee Reports-

Property- Kay said the floor had been put down in the den of the parsonage but nothing had been started in the basement.

James Lovell has said he would cut down the trees at no charge. It was mentioned that the indoor parsonage work should probably be completed before the tree removal takes place in order to not hinder any progress with that.

Worship- Ruth has ordered the palm leaves for the youth to carry in on Palm Sunday.

Media- Del found a site that has the bible scriptures and songs. He said Molly could do a copy and

paste from this site as versus hand typing in. This site would be at no charge.

New Business- G.B. said there is going to be a Christian based camp at Franklin Heights that would be held from 6/18-6/22. It is titled Winshape Camp for Youth. It is a youth camp for those who have completed first grade - middle school. It is a day camp with hours between 8:30 and 5:00. The cost per attendee would be \$214.00. G.B. proposed that the church possibly pay half that fee in the amount of \$107.00 per. G.B. thought there were around 3 youth that would fit the age criteria. Bud suggested that the church pay the 1/2 cost with a cap of \$535.00 which would cover 5 attendees. There will be a special offering to help fund this. Ruth made a motion to approve and Gusta seconded the motion, motion carried.

Calendar of Events- The community Easter Service will be at Trinity Church on Sunday, March 25th beginning at 6:30pm. Maundy Thursday service will be at Snow Creek, March 29th at 7:00pm. Easter Sunrise service will be at Boones Chapel this year with Snow Creek having the service. It will begin at 7:00am.

VBS at Pleasant Grove UMC June 25-29. Community events are rotated between 4 churches. Bill is going to confirm who hosts the Thanksgiving service this year.

Bill had our closing prayer.


Mr. Hanks was the Minister of Snow Creek Christian Church for 28 ½ years. He and his

BACHELOR BUTTON COOKIES

1 cup butter 2 cups flour 1 cup light brown sugar 1 tsp. soda 1 cup chopped 1 eaa

walnuts

1/8 tsp. salt 1 cup coconut



Mix in order listed. Roll into balls one inch in diameter. Press center with finger. Bake at 450 degrees for 5 minutes. Makes 5 dozen.

HOT HAMBURGER CASSEROLE

2 lbs. hamburger 1 (8 oz.) pkg. macaroni 2 medium onions, chopped salt and pepper to taste

1 cup grated American cheese 2 cans tomato soup

bread or cracker crumbs 2 soup cans of water

Brown hamburger and onions. Add tomato soup, water, uncooked macaroni, salt.and pepper. Pour into buttered casserole. Cover and bake for 1 hour at 350 degrees. Remove cover, stir in cheese. Cover with crumbs. Continue baking until brown, about 10 minutes. 5 cups strained, canned tomatoes may be used in place of soup and water if desired. Yield: 8 servings.






Rick

He is the son of Veronica Doyle and grandson of Mike and Pam Doyle








