Curtis and Louise were the last couple to be married in the old Church building of our Church (PICTURE ABOVE). The parents of both of them were at the wedding. Paul and Vergie Motley and Calvin and Lucille Washburn are included in the picture above. They were married in December 1953. Reverend George Renick performed the wedding. Most of the attendees followed Curtis and Louise to Martinsville in their vehicles after the reception. Curtis said he took several turns in Martinsville trying to lose the others in their cars. It was the custom to try to follow couples after the wedding in those days.

Curtis began attending the Church as a toddler when his mother would bring him to Church. He and his brother, Bobby, and sister, Lavern, attended the Church with their parents. He has continued to attend the Church all of his life. Louise began attending the Church as a youth. She and Curtis were very active in the Youth Group. They enjoyed trips to Lakeside and up the mountain. Curtis and Louise have 5 Children. All of the children have attended the Church. Most of the children continue to attend and support the church. They also have several grandchildren and great grandchildren that visit or attend the Church.



Memories of the Church by Curtis

"I was fortunate to start out and grow up with 2 wonderful parents. My mother was a school teacher and taught Sunday School in Church. I've been involved in Snow Creek Church since early childhood and I was baptized into the Church after accepting Christ at age 12. I was involved with the C.Y.F during my teenage years. I graduated from Franklin County High School at age 18 and attended Virginia Tech that year. I was much influenced by my parents and others. One person in my early years was Fannie Cook. She lived several miles into Turkey Cock Mountain and rode horse back to Church and most always was at Church. Snow and cold did not stop her. Sometimes

rain would but not always and sometimes she rode the horse with an umbrella. Several ministers were influential in my life. I think Reverend Barnwell baptized me in Snow Creek. These ministers were Reverend Carl Howard, Reverend Jimmie Goad, Reverend Mike Stump, and of course Reverend Berlin Hanks. My Sunday School teacher was Mrs. Adele Thompson. There were numerous other people who influenced my life. I have always been in Church even in college. I attended Blacksburg Christian Church. In 1953, Louise Motley and I were married in the original Snow Creek Church building by Reverend George Renick. We have 5 wonderful children. My wife is a great mother and even greater grandmother. Together, with family help and God's grace, we survived some tough financial times and are still working together after 56 years."
