

Pastor Scott and I arrived at this very unassuming building on an early, sleepy Monday morning the week of Thanksgiving. As we entered Heavenly Manna Food Bank, it was anything and everything BUT sleepy. Frances Davis, the director, graciously met us in the entry and invited us on a tour of the facility so that we could share with our church family how your generous donations are put to good use.

Every room of the building was bustling with volunteers gathering food from shelves, refrigerators, and walk-in freezers. Other volunteers were set up at an assembly line with lists in hand, selecting food items for each specific family size, and arranging those food products in containers ready for pick-up. (Clients must bring their own box to transfer food for pick-up, and families are limited to one box per month.)



Heavenly Manna serves an average of 1180 clients each month (17,860+ pounds of food and 300+ hours of volunteer labor)!!!

The Food Bank assistance is based on financial income guidelines established by the USDA. However, those who are over-qualified, yet have a need for food at this time, will be assisted.

**Heavenly Manna mission: “Any individual or family needing food or food assistance will be helped.”**

Frances Davis told us this mission is truly a labor of love - from all the weekly volunteers to the support from local churches, schools, businesses, and individual donors.

### **Volunteers needed!!!**

Covid-19 has caused a shortage of volunteers at local food banks as more and more people are sheltering in place. Local volunteer pools are usually made up of retired senior citizens with extra time to offer their services. Unfortunately, this is usually the at-risk population that is encouraged to stay home and stay safe. During the pandemic, donated food packages must be unloaded and either quarantined or wiped down and sanitized immediately. Drivers are also needed to deliver food to families unable to leave home.
