Reflections


Six weeks before Christmas in 1918 the most destructive war that humanity had known to that point came to an end. Returning from service as a chaplain on the front lines of World War I, the dean of King's College Chapel, a subsidiary of Cambridge University, sought to implement a new service to call the disenchanted population that he had served in the trenches away from the pubs and back to church on Christmas Eve. Eric Milner-White borrowed a simple liturgy of nine scripture lessons telling the story of humanity from the Fall to its redemption in Christ. Interspersed with these readings were carols performed by the legendary Choir of King's College.

The plan worked. The service was so successful that after a decade it began to be broadcast throughout Great Britain with the advent of a new device called radio. For the past nine decades, the BBC has annually broadcast live the Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols on radio and later television to millions around the world. The service and its broadcasts

continued even as the windows of the chapel had to be removed during the Nazi bombing campaigns of World War II. This year especially it is a remarkably simple but poignant reminder of the power of the Christian story to provide hope and inspiration even through humanity's darkest days.

Since much of our worship this year has been over the radio anyways, I thought that this might be a good model for Snow Creek's own Christmas Eve service this year. For those interested, you are invited to join us at 6 PM on December 24 to hear our own Nine Lessons and Carols. I will send out the readings and lyrics ahead of time so that you can read and sing along. Also, do not forget to bring communion. If you can't make it, I will send out an online version that evening as well. I look forward to seeing many of you and to wishing all of you a merry Christmas!



Christmas Special Offering - December 13 & 20

Throughout the year, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) takes up several special offerings to support denominational initiatives at the national level. The Christmas special offering stays right here in Virginia. This offering goes to finance the work of the 31 regional ministries that the Disciples of Christ have throughout the United States and Canada.

Snow Creek is part of the Virginia region which includes most of Virginia with the exception of Alexandria, Arlington, & Fairfax County. The office is headquartered in Lynchburg and, as of last year, welcomed Rev. Bill Spangler-Dunning (who was scheduled to be our speaker at Homecoming) as its new Regional Minister. This was not exactly the easiest time to start, but Rev. Spangler-Dunning has so far done an admirable job providing best-practices and resources for churches throughout a very uncertain and challenging situation. The Regional Office, among many other important tasks, also provides assistance for congregations in the Search & Call process of seeking new ministers; helps churches with conflict resolution; provides camp and youth activities for kids, teenagers, and young adults; shepherds prospective ministers (of which I am one) through the ordination process; and helps Disciples churches coordinate with one another for a variety of mission opportunities. All of this is done with a bare-bones staff and limited financial resources.

As we look forward to a promising and hopefully very different year in 2021, I would encourage everyone to prayerfully consider making a donation to support the region this Christmas season. Advent Devotions

Last year, I thoroughly enjoyed getting to read everyone else's devotions during Advent. You all did a great job of engaging with the Scriptures, sharing personal experiences of faith, and providing a wide range of perspectives to help prepare others for the celebration of Christ's coming. As with seemingly everything else this year, the logistics of compiling an Advent devotional written by 25 different people were a little more challenging. Something is better than nothing though, so as an inferior substitute I have picked back up with the email devotions that I had been sending out in the spring.

Advent is meant to be a time of reflection as we prepare for the reality that the Son of God came into the world as one of us and will one day come again. Each of these devotions comes with a scripture passage related to Advent. Most are either from the Old Testament prophecies of the coming of a Messiah or from the Apostle Paul's post-Christ expositions on what the coming of this Messiah meant for the world. I would also encourage everyone to, if you find these devotions useful, pair them with a moment of private prayer that you can remember to personally invite Christ into your life as we prepare to celebrate his coming into the world. My hope is that these devotions can provide you with a daily moment for quiet reflection to remember what it is that we are truly celebrating amidst the hustle and bustle of Christmas time.


