Special Thanks to Minister Scott and all the many people involved with the Outdoor Services that allow us to continue to worship at the Church.






Food Trunk Some of you may have noticed the large trunk that has been up

on the porch of the church the last few Sundays. George Martin,

in conjunction with the Rotary Club and Heavenly Manna Food Pantry, has set up a food collection point at the church to supplement the food distribution area located at the Snow Creek Rescue Squad. What we would like to do is have people drop off non-perishable food items (canned tuna, peanut butter, soup, etc.) each Sunday or during the week. These will then be sent to the pickup area at the Rescue Squad as a convenient pickup location for those in need in the community who might have difficulty driving into a food pantry in Rocky Mount or Martinsville. Any excess will then be sent to Heavenly Manna in Rocky Mount to be distributed there. So while you are making your weekly grocery run, pick up a few extra items bring them with you to church to place in the trunk. It is a simple way for us to help our neighbors right here in the Snow Creek community who may be in need and to share the love and daily bread with which God has so richly blessed us.
