Reflections

The final Sunday of this new month is the celebration of Pentecost. It occurs every year exactly fifty days after Easter Sunday, the word Pentecost literally meaning fiftieth in Greek. The celebration, however, predates Easter as it was originally a Jewish pilgrimage festival meant to commemorate the giving of the Law to Moses and occurring fifty days after the Passover festival. Christians appropriated it to celebrate God's giving of the Holy Spirit that occurs during the Pentecost festivities according to Luke's account in Acts.

The disciples there become filled with the Holy Spirit and as people from all over the world flock into Jerusalem they begin proclaiming the teachings and revelations of Jesus in a myriad of different languages. Some respond to what must have sounded like incoherent babble by dismissing the disciples as a bunch of drunks who must have been enjoying the festivities a bit too much, but Luke tells us that others responded in amazement and asked, "What does this mean?"

As May completes the transition of the world around us from winter into summer, the question is still an appropriate one. On nature's calendar new life becomes abundant as the season of spring reaches its peak. The leaves are back on the trees. The grass (and the weeds) are growing. April showers have brought May flowers. A similar phenomenon occurs on the church's

calendar. The season of Easter which stretches from Easter Sunday to

Pentecost Sunday is meant to bring new life in similar fashion.

By the time Luke's account reaches the day of Pentecost, the newly resurrected Jesus has ascended to the heavens and has left in his place God's Holy Spirit. This event of the Spirit filling the disciples and them beginning to proclaim the Good News to people from all over the world is often regarded as the birth of the church. As we move through this season of Easter during the month of May, the question of the onlookers that day is still relevant, "What does this mean?" We have declared that "Christ is risen, indeed." Do we now just wait around for summer to come and school to be out and our beach vacations to roll around? Or do we begin to examine what Christ's resurrection means for our lives? Do we search for how this Holy Spirit is moving us and the church? We have been gifted the Holy Spirit by God through Christ. Now what do we do with it? The month of May and the season of Easter are an opportune time to revisit that question of, "What does this mean?"

Board Minutes

Snow Creek Christian Church Board Meeting

12-February-2023

G.B. called the meeting to order. Scott had our opening prayer. Minutes were reviewed. Joyce made a motion to approve the minutes and Linda seconded the motion, motion carried.

Treasurer's Report- Bud had the treasurer's report for the months of December and January since we did not meet in January. There were 5 offerings in the month of December counting the Disciples of Christ Christmas offering totaling \$7741.00. There was \$50.00 in donations made to the backpack program bringing the total giving to \$7791.00. Total expenses for the month of December were \$7048.00.

There were also 5 offerings in the month of January totaling \$7766.00. There was \$50.00 in donations for the backpack program and \$5548.00 for the year-end gift that brought the total giving to \$13,364.00. Operating expenses were typical except for the utilities which jumped from \$585.00 to \$1373.00 due to an above average electric bill. Operating expenses do include electric, phone and B2X however electric was the sole cause of the extreme increase. Bud expects the next electric bill to be high as well. There could be a couple of potential causes which will be further evaluated. It could be a thermostat issue. It could be an issue with the furnace that Curtis said was installed in 1953 and parts are no longer available for. There is also an air handler in the attic that G.B. is going to contact Sammy St. Clair about. Barbara made a motion to approve the report and Kay seconded, motion passed.

Pastor's Report- Scott said there have been three Lenten services scheduled to be held jointly with Pleasant Grove Church. The Ash Wednesday service will be on February 22nd at Pleasant Grove. The Maundy Thursday service will be at Snow Creek on April 6th. The Good Friday service will be at Pleasant Grove on April 7th.

Lent begins on February 22nd and Scott plans to resume sending the daily Lenten devotions by e-mail. Scott wanted to thank everyone who helped while he was gone to Kentucky. Bob Mooty who served as guest preacher had high praise for the congregation. Scott is now looking at having to go back to Kentucky in June.

Dates for this summer's Vacation Bible School have been set. It will begin on Sunday evening, July 9th and run through Thursday, July 13th at Pleasant Grove. Snow Creek is scheduled to host the summer of 2024.

Scott is waiting to hear from Bill Spangler-Dunning in regards to him serving as our guest pastor at homecoming. He had been scheduled to come in 2021 when homecoming was cancelled.

Scott wanted to thank everyone who helped with the adult Sunday school class held this morning. This helped Scott to complete all his requirements for a class he took at intensives. He is

hoping to have all the follow-up work for those classes completed this week. He will begin another class on February 27th.

Scott will be taking vacation days Friday, February 17th and Monday, February 20th. He will be here Sunday the 19th.

New Business- There has not been a date set yet for the Easter Egg Hunt. Use of the church for a community exercise group is off the table as it believed they are using Trinity Church.




