### Reflections

It is not fair. This month, my wife finally gets some time off from her job as a teacher, my kids are out of school, many of you in the congregation have vacations planned as summer has arrived. I, on the other hand, have to go to class. Not only that, but I have a whole day's drive just to get there.

I will be out of town from June 19th through June 26th taking intensive courses on-site at Lexington Theological Seminary in Lexington, Kentucky. Most of my schooling for seminary I am able to do online so that I can be here serving the church simultaneously. Intensives, however, are what they sound like: intense. I will be in one class all day for several days straight and I have several pre-class and post-class projects due before and after. This session will be particularly intense as I have to complete two of the 'crucible' classes of the curriculum: Exegesis (that is the fancy seminary word for interpreting scripture) and Sermon Preparation. As part of those classes, I will have to preach several sermons on multiple texts and then be critiqued on every aspect of the process.

If I am being honest, I am not looking forward at all to taking these courses. That may sound a bit strange considering that I do biblical exegesis and prepare a sermon on a passage of scripture every week and have for the past four years. One would think that I would have figured out what I am doing by now. There is, however, a

level of humility, or maybe I should say a humiliation, involved in learning how much better one could be at their craft.

On the other hand, it is always good to be challenged and to grow. I feel sure that the seminary will take care of the former, but I am hopeful that through that process I will experience the latter. And hopefully you will too. That is, after all, the purpose of learning about the scriptures or coming to listen to a sermon. Jesus was not in the entertainment business. His ministry was to transform the relationship we all have with God; to help us to grow in our faith, especially when we are challenged. We can always learn from the scriptures and benefit from seeing them in a new light. Even if you don't have to preach a sermon, we can all learn new ways to share our faith with the world through words and our actions.

While I am gone, you all will be in good hands in that regard. Bob Mooty, who filled in for me in January and is my former pastor and current mentor, will lead worship on June 25<sup>th</sup>, the Sunday that I will be away. Other than that, plans are pretty much business as usual for the rest of June. But just because school is out for the kids doesn't mean we can't all learn, grow, and be challenged by God. No matter how much I want whine about it beforehand.



Scott asked to be reimbursed the fee of \$140.00, the board approved. Scott will be gone on August 27 for a wedding.

G.B. moved the board meeting in May to the 21st due to Mother's day.

Sammy St. Clair came to check out the air conditioner and it turns out that the unit on the roof will need to be replaced. The estimate to replace is around \$6,000.00 plus whatever it cost to get it on the roof (crane).

The church will be participating in the Yard Sale on June 3. Barbara made a motion to rent a space for \$25.00, Linda seconded, motion passed.

## Memorial Day




Ken Beall gave a speech to the Church Family about the meaning of Memorial Day and the importance of honoring our fallen Veterans.


