Reflections



As of this writing, I do not know what the groundhog's official meteorological prediction is for the duration of winter, but I do know that it will end sometime. Thus, it will soon be time to prepare for spring and also time for the church to prepare for Easter. In doing so, it is important that this involve more than just cleaning and decorating. There needs to be spiritual preparation as well.

Christians of all stripes tend to love Christmas and rightfully so, but Easter should be seen as the central celebration of the church. This is the commemoration of the miracle that the light of Christ can overcome even that shadow of death that follows us all of our lives and consumes us at the end. It is our annual reminder that between God and death, God wins. It is the core of the Christian Gospel and

certainly deserves some time for us to get ready.

To do so, many Christians participate in the observation of Lent. This is a season of forty days leading up to Easter - if you are counting on your calendar, skip Sundays, they are not included where Christians special pay attention to the elements of the world that call them away from faith in God, namely temptation to sin and fear of death. The forty days are meant to symbolize the forty days that Jesus spent in the wilderness while being tempted by

Satan in preparation for the start of his ministry.

Lent was not actually practiced by the early disciples in the New Testament. Therefore, some churches do not put much emphasis on it. However, its practice does date back to the very early church — even before the celebration of Christmas — and can serve an important function in calling Christians to focus on the aspects of their own lives that need to change in order to be more in tune with the God who grants us salvation.

To participate, I would encourage you to take advantage of several options. First, adopt a Lenten discipline. Many people give up a habit (smoking, alcohol, red meat, sweets, etc.) for the forty days to simulate Jesus' temptation

experience. I would encourage everyone to couple this with picking up a habit. This could include volunteering, increasing your giving, daily prayer, or just making an effort to do a kind act for someone each day.

Secondly, adopt a Lenten devotion. Join our adult Sunday school class, participate in a Lenten study that we are planning for the parents in the church, or follow along in a devotional booklet. I am looking into a few options for these – do not worry, you will not have to write anything this time.

Finally, worship. Make a point to come and celebrate God each Sunday in Lent. Bring a

friend or family member. Lent will begin on February 26 and I would love to have you join us for a joint Ash Wednesday service at 6:30 at Pleasant Grove United Methodist Church. There will be several other special Lenten services that will be announced later that I think you will also find very meaningful.

As the days slowly start to get longer and the temperatures eventually start to rise remember that spring will be here one day and with it, Easter. Join us as we work to get ready.


