eware the Ides of March. This was the Dadvice of the soothsayer to Julius Caesar that was made famous in William Shakespeare's play of the same name. The ides of March were a minor Roman holiday that occurred on the 15th of March and also the fateful dav of Caesar's assassination. Shakespeare borrowed the account of this warning from the Roman historian Plutarch who tells of Caesar mocking the soothsayer that day, telling him, "the Ides of March are come" on his way to the theatre, to which the soothsaver replied, "Aye Caesar; but not gone." The rest is history.

I bring this up because the 15th of March, 2020 was the last time that we had services inside the sanctuary. The Ides of March came but before they were gone the state government had begun putting regulations on public gatherings and, as you know, the rest is now history.

Then the 1st Sunday of April, April 4th, we will once again celebrate in some form or fashion the Good News of Christ's Resurrection that sustains us all. Who knows if March will come in like a lion or go out like a lamb. Regardless, God will be with us through it all and has already given us so much to hope for.
