# Reflections

The way the calendar lines up this year, December 1<sup>st</sup> is actually the first day of Advent. All four Sundays of Advent fall within this month as does, of course, Christmas, so I thought I would use the candles on the Advent wreath to highlight some of the events

that our church has going on as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ.

HOPE (December 1<sup>st</sup>) – The first candle of Advent is meant to represent hope, the shimmer of light that God's grace continues to shine forth even as the darkness of winter sets in. As we look for-

ward in hopeful anticipation of Christ's coming, the youth are planning to help us decorate accordingly. Our annual Hanging of the Greens will be this Sunday as we prepare both our church and our hearts for the coming of the Son of God.

**LOVE** (December 8<sup>th</sup>) – OK, nothing fancy going on this Sunday, but that's alright because love is supposed to be at the center of every Sunday. It is why we worship, to show

<u>CHRIST</u> (DECEMBER 24<sup>th</sup>) – On that Tuesday night at 9:00 PM we will gather for


our special candlelight Christmas Eve service as we light the Christ candle in thanksgiving for the light that God sent into the world through Jesus Christ on that dark Christmas night.




## **Christmas Special Offering**

## **Committee Reports**

• Property – Joyce reported that with the breakfast coming up on October 4<sup>th</sup>, a new coffee pot and new frying pan have been purchased.

## **Old business**

He asked the Board to consider including an approximately 7% increase for Pastor Scott in the budget, pending Bud Hippisley's confirmation that the budget can support it.

G.B. Washburn called the meeting to order. Pastor Scott had our opening prayer. The September meeting minutes were reviewed. Joyce Ingram made a motion to approve the minutes, Linda Hippisley seconded, the motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report** – Bud reported for September. Giving receipts were \$7614 and Expenses were \$6930. Backpack receipts were \$890 and Expenses were \$1943. Doug Perdue made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report, Janet Perdue seconded, the motion carried.

## Pastor's Report

- Over \$2000 in donated cleaning supplies for hurricane Helene victims in southwest Virginia were delivered to Boones Mill Christian Church pastor Smith-Arrington. The supplies will be transported to Pearisburg Christian Church for distribution.
- Suggestion from Scott to participate in an additional Week of Compassion offering to collect donations that will benefit Hurricane Helene victims. Motion by Linda and seconded by Bud to conduct the additional offering. Motion carried.
- The funeral for Debbie Haynes will be Saturday, October 19, 2024 at 11am. A meal will be provided by the church following the service.
- Trunk or Treat will be held Sunday, October 27<sup>th</sup> from 5:30-7:30pm.
- Scott is working with Patti Amos on the annual Christmas pageant. A date will be determined soon.
- SCCC will host a District 4 Christmas gathering on Sunday, December 29<sup>th</sup>. The time and schedule will be determined in the next month.
- The Board approved Scott to work from home on Monday, October 14<sup>th</sup>.

## **Committee Reports**

 Property – Joyce reported that she is working with a contractor to repair some of the entry doors.

### Old business




